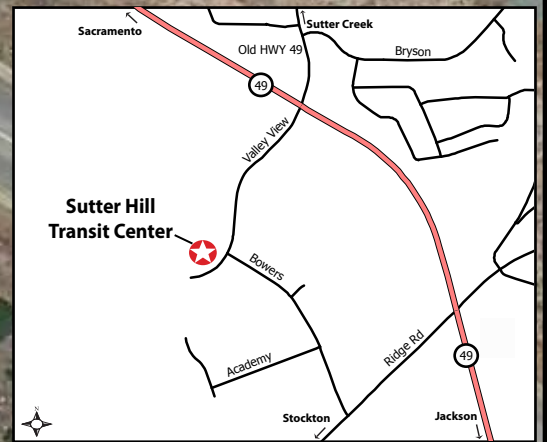

Sutter Hill Transit Center Walking Tour Map

The SHTC project is a partnership between Amador Transit (AT) and the Amador County Transportation Commission (ACTC) that was funded entirely by State and Federal grants. It is one of the first rural Transit Oriented Development (TOD) projects in the State of California. The Sutter Hill Transit Center (SHTC) is centrally located in Amador County with respect to highways, the airport, high density housing, and commerce. It provides an opportunity for people to be less reliant on their automobile. It includes four parts; 1-Bus terminal, 2-Park and Ride, 3-Sutter Creek City Park, 4-Teleconference Center.

1. Amador Transit Bus Terminal/Council of Tourism

The bus terminal is the "hub" of Amador Transit's (AT's) bus service. It starts early every weekday morning when commuters using AT's Sacramento Express bus arrive to catch their ride to work. Local service then continues throughout the day (see separate Amador Transit bus schedule available at www.amadortransit.com or at the terminal itself). All of the bus routes begin or end at this terminal.

The bus terminal is also the home office for Amador Council of Tourism. The Council of Tourism provides information for visitors to Amador County.

2. Park and Ride

The 44 space Park and Ride facility provides ample parking for persons wishing to telecommute to Sacramento or to bring their car in from rural areas of the County and utilize AT's bus system. It also provides overflow parking for the Teleconference Center. Free electric car charging and public access to the city park is also available.

3. Sutter Creek City Park

The City park preserves the site's heritage Oaks and unique rock outcroppings while providing a relaxing space for people otherwise using the Park and Ride, Bus Terminal, or Teleconference Center. It has also become a popular "dog walk" for area residents and a picnic area for visitors to the County.

4. ACTC/Teleconference Center

This building houses the ACTC office. It includes meeting facilities for local public and private organizations. The meeting facilities include full teleconferencing capability. This enables persons to conduct meetings with other agencies outside of the County without having to travel outside of the County. ACTC has also formed a partnership with the Amador Community College Foundation who is using the facility for adult enrichment and distance learning classes.
